BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR VARIOUS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS BY THE TOWNSHIP OF EDISON, IN THE COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING THE AGGREGATE AMOUNT OF \$6,080,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$5,788,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE TOWNSHIP TO FINANCE PART OF THE COST THEREOF.

ORDINANCE O.1817-2012

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF EDISON, IN THE COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The several improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby respectively authorized to be undertaken by the Township of Edison, New Jersey as general improvements. For the several improvements or purposes described in Section 3, there are hereby appropriated the respective sums of money therein stated as the appropriation made for each improvement or purpose, such sums amounting in the aggregate to \$6,080,000 and including the aggregate sum of \$292,000 as the several down payments for the improvements or purposes required by the Local Bond Law. The down payment monies have been made available by virtue of provision for down payment or for capital improvement purposes in one or more previously adopted budgets.

Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the several improvements or purposes not covered by application of the several down payments, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$5,788,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of the bonds, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

Section 3. The several improvements hereby authorized and the several purposes for which the bonds are to be issued, the estimated cost of each improvement and the

appropriation therefor, the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for each improvement and the period of usefulness of each improvement are as follows:

(a) Providing for the purchase of an automated truck w/plow, 95 gallon receptacles, and various equipment for the Department of Public Works.

Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer. The chief financial officer shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8.1. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The capital budget of the Township of Edison is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith.

Section 6. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses. They are all improvements that the Township may lawfully undertake as general improvements, and no part of the costs thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

(b) The average period of usefulness, computed on the basis of the respective amounts of obligations authorized for each purpose and the reasonable life thereof within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, is 8.86 years.

(c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the Township as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$5,788,000, and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by that Law.

(d) \$250,000 is estimated for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated costs indicated herein for the purposes or improvements.

Section 7. The full faith and credit of the Township are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Township, and the Township shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Township for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 8. This bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

WHEREAS, the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1, et seq., authorizes municipalities to determine whether certain parcels of land in the municipality constitute a redevelopment area or an area in need of rehabilitation; and

WHEREAS, to determine whether certain parcels of land constitute a redevelopment area or an area in need of rehabilitation, the Township Council must authorize the Planning Board to undertake a preliminary investigation of the area and make recommendations to the Township Council; and

WHEREAS, the Township Council wishes the Planning Board to undertake a preliminary investigation and to make a determination in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-5 and/or N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-14 as to whether the following area within the property commonly known as Camp Kilmer, or any part thereof, meets the statutory criteria to be designated a redevelopment area or an area in need of rehabilitation, being proposed new Lot 3.011 (consisting of approximately 305,925 square feet or 7.02 acres), Lot 3.012 (consisting of approximately 97,807 square feet or 2.25 acres), Lot 3.013 (consisting of approximately 185,728 square feet or 4.26 acres), Lot 3.014 (consisting of approximately 289,686 square feet or 6.65 acres), and Lot 3.015 (consisting of approximately 158,608 square feet or 3.64 acres) as depicted on the Proposed Subdivision Plan for Block 3-E, Lot 3.01 prepared by Control Layouts, Inc. dated November 23, 2010 as revised through June 8, 2011; and

WHEREAS, if the Planning Board should find that this area within Camp Kilmer, or any part thereof, meets the statutory criteria to be designated a redevelopment area or an area in need of rehabilitation, the Township Council wishes the Planning Board to prepare a redevelopment plan for the area pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-7(f).

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Council of the Township of Edison, County of Middlesex, State of New Jersey that:

1. The Planning Board is hereby authorized and directed to undertake a preliminary investigation to make a determination in accordance with the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1, et seq. as to whether the aforescribed area of Camp Kilmer, or any part thereof, meets the statutory criteria to be designated a redevelopment area or an area in need of rehabilitation, and to report to the Township Council regarding their findings, determinations and recommendations; and,

2. If the Planning Board should find that the aforescribed area of Camp Kilmer, or any part thereof, meets the statutory criteria to be designated a redevelopment area or an area in need of rehabilitation, the Planning Board is hereby authorized and directed to prepare a redevelopment plan for the area or a part thereof pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-7(f) and to forward the same to the Township Council for consideration.

WHEREAS, in an effort to reduce New Jersey's reliance on institutional care, the Task Force on the Closure of State Developmental Centers was created by state Legislature and charged with reviewing certain criteria of each of the state-operated facilities including but not limited to the local economic impact of losing a center; the ability of a community to provide or develop services for those leaving who wanted to leave or didn't oppose moving outside the region; the state's ability to maintain operations, and projected repair and maintenance of each center; and

WHEREAS, among the seven state-operated facilities for this purpose is the Woodbridge Development Center(hereafter referred to as WDC), a residential facility established in 1965 for persons with developmental disabilities and located on 68 acres in the Avenel section of Woodbridge Township; and

WHEREAS, in July (2012), the task force recommended WDC (and North Jersey Developmental Center in Passaic County) be shuttered by 2017; and

WHEREAS, while indicating that no one piece of information or experience was a determining factor in which of the seven state operated facilities would be recommended for closure, there are other factors that should have been considered before making their decision. These factors include the rights (federal law requires government to meet the needs of the individual) of the clients at WDC to have treating professionals make judgments about how their needs are best met and that transferring clients from long-term institutional care to community housing has its own set of problems including higher rates of morality and increased likelihood of abuse in a community; and

WHEREAS, the Municipal Council of the Township of Edison is deeply concerned by not only the recommendation by the task force to displace WDC clients but the wide-reaching economic effect with the loss of approximately 1,600 jobs in our community. The opinion that Woodbridge's relatively strong economy is more able to absorb a closure should not be relative to the task force's decision.
